



## SOHO PARISH PRIMARY - P.E. AND SPORTS GRANT FUNDING 2023-24

Sport Premium is an amount of money, which the government has agreed to allocate to schools to increase the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, and increase participation in PE and Sport. The funding amount received by schools is based upon the number of children of primary age at the school.

At Soho Parish CofE Primary School the PE team have the responsibility for developing PE and Sport and deciding upon the effective use of Sport Premium Funding. We welcome the additional funding, which will enable an excellent provision of PE, Sport and fitness, essential for children living in central London with often-limited access to outside space.
